

The students had the opportunity to try an underwater drone that is made from recyclable materials and powered by an Arduino.

They experienced interactive virtual reality by Xi Academy and various other companies demonstrated different drone and robotic applications and CSIRO brought their eight legged robots that are used for exploration. 










PUT IT THROUGH FOR TWO
