A little background on Justice Lonergan follows:

HH Lonergan was called to the bar in 1997, she developed a very highly regarded broad common law practice. In 2012, she was appointed Senior Counsel. Justice Lonergan is an expert in the area of medical negligence. She is a great mentor to students as well as a strong role model and advocate for women in the legal profession. Justice Lonergan was appointed to the Supreme Court of NSW in March 2017.

Daniel is currently sitting for his HSC and attended court with HH Lonergan just prior to the examination period. He had a wonderful day and learned a great deal. This was a particularly valuable experience for Daniel as he intends to study Law at university.

Students of Year Nine Geography recently travelled to the city to undertake fieldwork. Their brief was to examine urban change. Students visited the Goods Line and investigated urban renewal, gentrification and the ways in which infrastructure can be re-used. Visiting locations in the city precincts highlighted the challenges of urbanisation and green architecture in urban spaces.

A ferry ride from Pyrmont to Circular Quay led us to Customs House where the city model provided a unique view of how the city works. All students were engaged in the fieldwork process and now have a deeper understanding of the various challenges of Sydney's built environment.




2019 Interschool Results

The Junior chess team, in board playing order, was Louie Comtiogianni, Aiden Cassaniti, Abdullah Banday and James Nanson. The boys are to be highly commended for their commitment as all matches were played on Fridays after school and every second match we travelled to the opposition school.

Highlights for our team were wins over teams from Homebush Boys and Meridan Girls (both scores 3-1). A strong team from Sydney Boys visited our school and we surprised them on Board 4 when James won (for a 1-3 loss). Against Trinity Grammar A, we lost quickly on lower boards. However the Board 1 battle was exciting, when Louie had their top player on the ropes with a solid endgame advantage, until disaster struck...

Louie's opponent as black played the tricky 1. ... Rh1, with two threats. Firstly against the undefended h pawn, which Louie spotted and reacted to by 2. h5? Unfortunately this loses to the deadly 2. ... Rh3 check, forcing the King to move, exposing the undefended Rb3 to capture.

Our team finished 5th out of 8 with a score of 11/28. An excellent result for a new team.
