

These types of conversations are an invaluable experience and resource for our students and I'm pleased to say they used this time well and showed themselves to be fine representatives of our school.


## **SCIENCE - STEM**

Term 4 started with a focus on STEM. Stem involves fields that are collectively considered to bring forth the skills in the technological area for an advanced society. Students of Year 7 were engaged through fun and hard work in hands on experiences to bring about real learning. Students used makey makey to change their learning world into an interactive, fun filled scenario that would engage fellow students. Most of the classes have finished their first round and the some impressive projects will represent their classes in the final round in two weeks.



Year 8 students have embarked on a project using sphero robots to "Game set and Race" and win the title of the Ashfield charioteer 2019. Students are making their own chariots to race them with the robots. The grand final will be in Week 9 after all the classes have done the first round of races.

The program brings out the exceptional designing ability coupled with teamwork to break all engineering stereotypes. It brings to the surface the helpful nature among students as they mentor other students in the project.




