Ashfield Boys High School developed a shared vision for excellence in 2015 and all sections of the school community - students, teachers and parents have worked towards its realisation. At the core of this vision is the outcome of individual excellence and personal success for every student.

The achievement of this is reflected in the high level of school success across a range of indicators. Student success in the HSC is outstanding with valued added data well above state average and high levels of university entrance. The school was identified by CESE as one of five sites across NSW with high and consistent HSC achievement from 2014-2018. Students self-report on the Tell Them from Me Survey consistently shows a school population with wellbeing and engagement indicators well above the NSW male average.

The school has engaged its community as an active partner in learning and this has resulted in strong mutually beneficial relationships with organisations such as Ashfield RSL and Wests Ashfield Leagues Club. The high levels of community engagement is reflected in a dynamic P&C and strong enrolment growth in a location ringed by independent schools. The reputation of Ashfield Boys High School as a school that is inclusive, caring, supportive and which fosters student-voice, leadership and a positive form of masculinity is well understood by the whole community. A shared vision has supported the upgrade of physical and ICT facilities which foster learning that is dynamic, collaborative and engaging.

Mr Tenefrancia is an exemplary teacher whose positive impact has been felt across the entire school community. As a teacher of Mathematics he is an inspiration to students who consistently achieve outstanding results in the HSC. Mr Tenefrancia's work is an example to his colleagues of quality teaching in action and the impact that this can have on students learning, their lives and their post school life chances. He looks constantly for ways of assisting students, particularly those who experience educational disadvantage, to achieve their maximum potential.

Mr Tenefrancia's classes are a model of high student engagement and achievement. The high level of engagement in active learning fostered by him, is evident in every setting, whether it be Year 12 Extension 2 Mathematics or younger students faced with intellectual disabilities. Mr Tenefrancia's superior ability to promote student success was recognised this year when researchers from CESE studied his teaching of Stage 6 Mathematics. The aim of this was to uncover state-wide best practice in schools with sustained high achievement in the HSC between 2014 and 2018.

Beyond the classroom context, Mr Tenefrancia consistently demonstrates his firm commitment to equity of opportunity and belief in the empowering potential of education. In multiple and diverse roles such as Year Adviser, International Students Coordinator and the coach of sporting teams he empowers students to be the best that they can be in all that they do. Mr Tenefrancia is held in the highest regard by all sections of the School community.





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




YEAR 7 CAMP

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DIGGING DEEP IN SCIENCE

Senior Chemistry students have been investigating Le Chatelier's Principle in their depth study and examining the effect of changes to temperature, concentration and pressure on a reaction at equilibrium. Depth studies in Stage 6 are designed to provide opportunities for students to:

- consolidate their learning
- develop competence and confidence in relation to their knowledge and skills
- foster creativity by allowing students to apply their knowledge and skills to new situations.




