






YEAR 8 DRAMA ENSEMBLE

The Shrimp Club is returning this year encouraging and providing open-ended scientific investigation amongst our students.

The Shrimp Club differentiates itself from our weekly Science Club with the aim of establishing a long term scientific study on shrimps. The research will be student-led and driven by their own curiosity and interests. Students will be required to critically think and solve problems as they arise and design and construct their own aquatic environment based on their research from scientifically sound sources.

Students are encouraged to keep a logbook of their observations and any tests that they conduct for future analysis and report writing.

The club is designed as an extra-curricular activity and meets once a week during lunch on Tuesday. Students can devote more time to cater for their experiments throughout the week if they wish.

The teacher supervising will encourage students to keep their setup costs minimal but please understand the club is not able to satisfy all material and design needs that students propose, and students may ask for your assistance to fulfil their design needs. Students maintain full ownership of any materials that they bring to the club.
