

Seeing the exhibition has allowed the students to determine the standard of work they should aim towards.


The exhibition is designed to assist students with planning and ideas for their own HSC artworks.

Year 9 MAA students rolling a die to investigate the relationship between Experimental probability and Theoretical probability.

Students worked in groups rolling a die 100 times.

In effect, they are demonstrating that observed probability tends towards Theoretical probability given an increased number of trials.







### **APPLES OR ONIONS**

Did you know? 80% of your taste sensation comes from your olfactory receptors (nose).

Students performed a taste challenge, to rely only on papillae (taste buds) to distinguish between onion and apple. Without a sense of sight or smell, most students had to guess if it was an onion or apple they were tasting.

### THE CHAIR OF LITERATURE


As part of our focus on literature, 10C has had the opportunity to read from the chair of literature.






