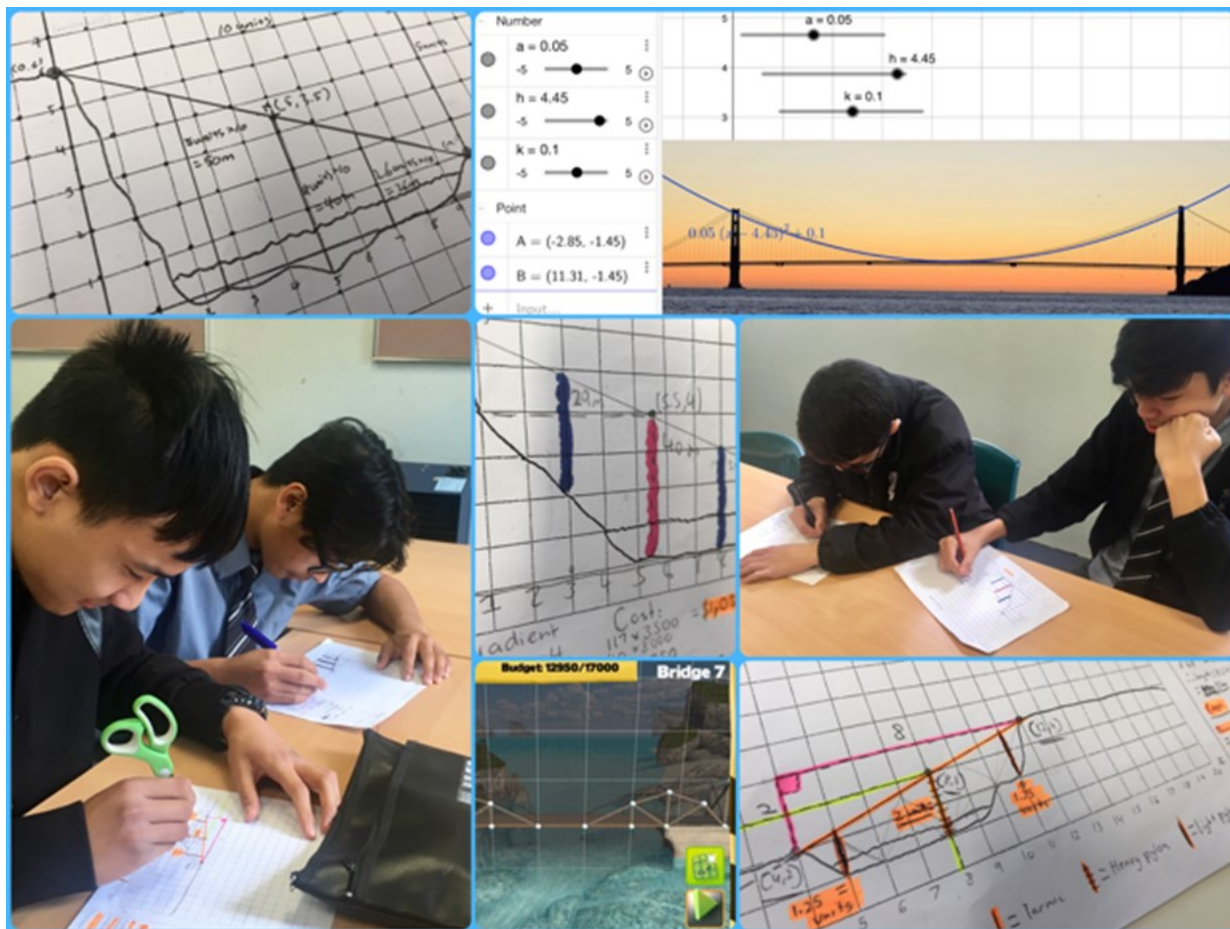

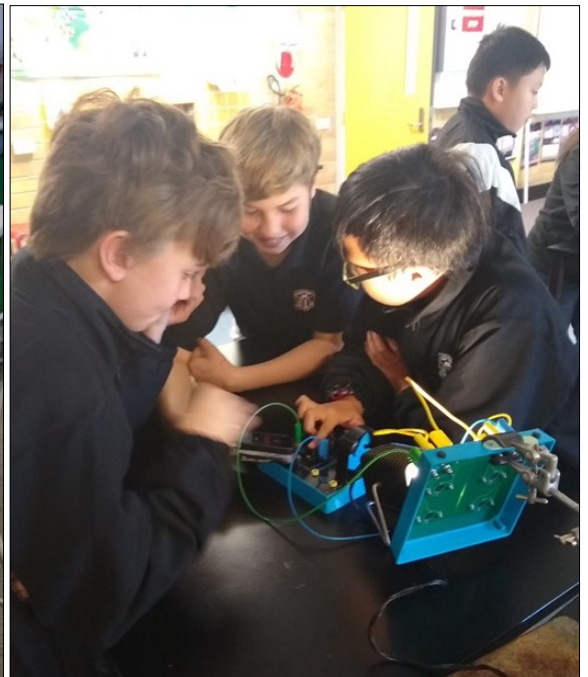

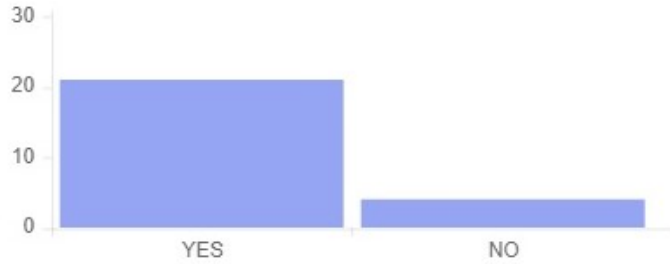

## YEAR 9 VIDEO GAME HABITS

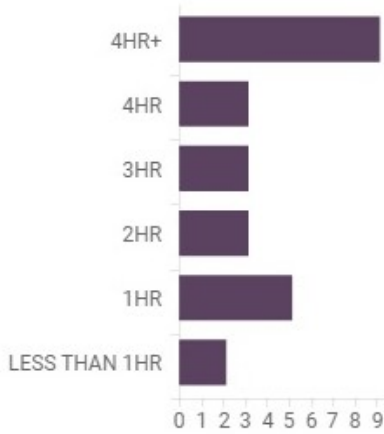
The video games market is expected to be worth over 90 billion U.S. dollars by 2020. There are more than 2.5 billion video gamers from all over the world.

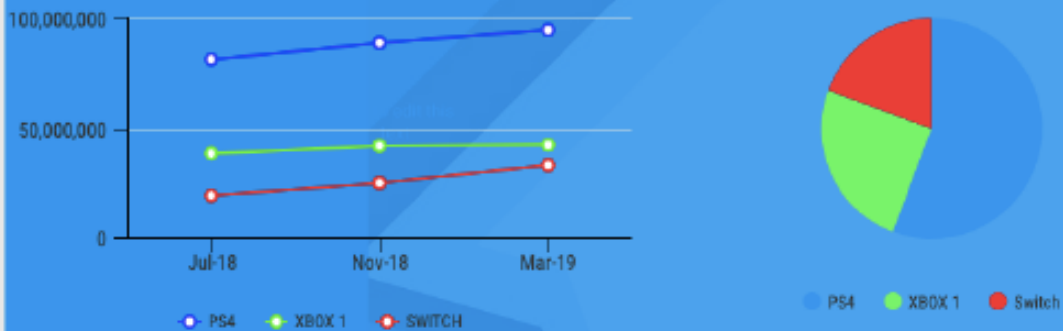

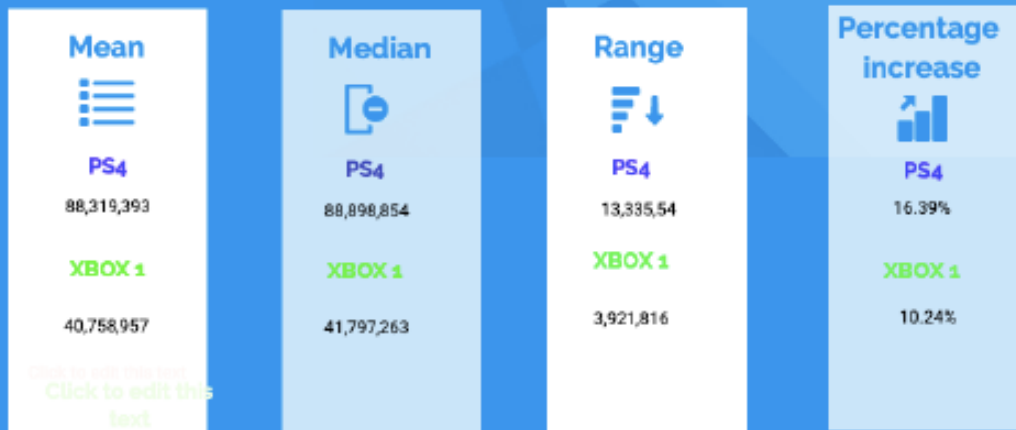
## PS4 vs XBOX 1

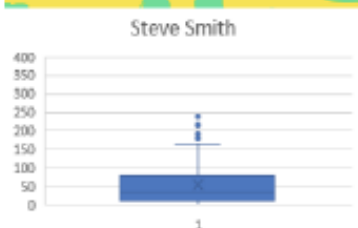

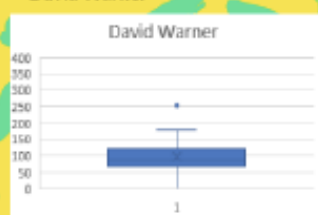

This is a box and whisker plot of all of Don Bradman's scores over his test innings

To accurately determine who the better batsman is between David Warner, Steve Smith and Don Bradman you have to analyse the Box and whisker plots for all 3 batsman. What we see with the batsman's box and whisker plots is that David Warner is the most consistent batsman of the three as his box is smaller than the other batsman. But the batsman that has scored the most runs is Don Bradman as his box is much bigger and so is the high score. Also what stands out is that Steve Smith's median score is smaller than David Warner's and Donald Bradman. Therefore from the Data I have collected I believe that Donald Bradman is the best batsman of the three as he is somewhat consistent with his runs and he has got the most amount of runs between the 3 batsman

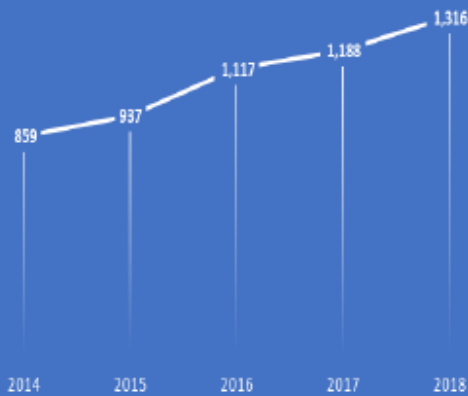


### Crime categories highest occurring offences 2014-2018



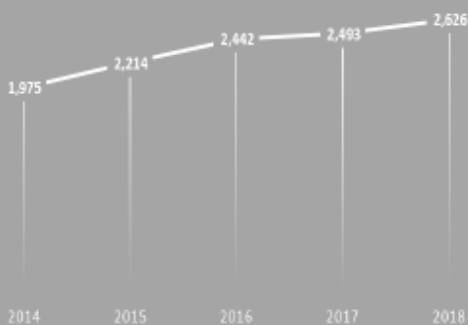

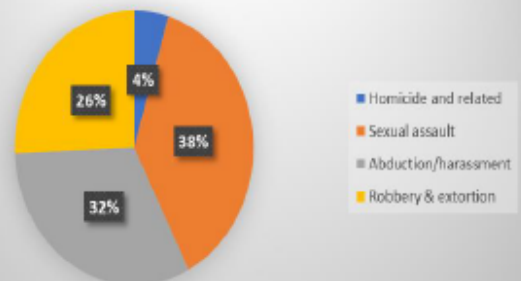

### WHICH STATE HAS THE LOWEST CRIME RATE?

Answer: The Australian Capital Territory (ACT).

The data analysis shows how little crime rates there are in the ACT compared to the larger states such as Queensland, Victoria and New South Wales. Percentage comparison between Queensland and the ACT shows that there are 31.7% more defendants finalized in QLD than in the ACT, which is a significant difference, especially when tied in with the rest of the states.
