PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

COVID Restrictions Ease

The NSW Department of Education advised us last night that the current suite of COVID restrictions will ease from Monday 8th March. This move has been made in consultation with NSW Health and reflects the lack of community transmission in NSW for over 40 days as well as the commencement of the vaccination program. The exact details of this easing will be released to schools later today but it will involve changes to musical performances, singing and school visits by parents and the community.





We will continue to be vigilant and maintain our current very high state of preparedness in case of a sudden change. Thanks for the wonderful response that we have had from our parent community in support of this—we have all moved through this together. 


CURIOSITY AND PERSEVERANCE







Science is a beautiful discipline not because it creates wonderful things, but of its demonstration of human *curiosity* and *perseverance*.

MATHEMATICS TEXTBOOK INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Parents have raised a number of enquiries concerning the availability of textbooks in Mathematics.

With the introduction of the NSW Australian Curriculum in Years 7 -10 in recent years, the NSW texts for the Australian Curriculum have become considerably larger in size and weight. As such it was decided that the latest textbooks when purchased would remain at school.

The latest textbooks can be accessed through a GOOGLE classroom code or an EDMODO group code set up by the classroom teacher or the student may bring in a USB to obtain a PDF copy of the textbook.

At present, a number of classes use the old textbooks which are then supplemented with paper copies of the new material when needed. The old textbooks may be issued to students to use at home upon parent request.

In addition, the Mathematics faculty use Mathspace as the online learning platform for every student in Years 7-10 to access. Mathspace can be tailored to meet the learning needs of individuals. It may also be used by staff for the setting of homework and it is also a useful tool for students to use as revision in preparation for tests, and as a way to catch up on missed work.

Mathspace, GOOGLE Classroom and MsTeams are web based programs which require access to a computer and the internet. However, if access to technology is an issue then alternate arrangements can be made. Please contact: Head Teacher Mathematics Ms Thomas.


