Congratulations to the Year 8 debating team consisting of Joshua, Daniel, Tomas and Ethan who this week progressed again to the NSW Semi Finals of the Premier's Debating Challenge. The boys have convincingly defeated every selective school in our regional draw. This is a wonderful result for the boys and their incredibly proud coach Mr Ricardson.

As I am sure you are aware, the educational achievement of boys across the country is a hot topic in the media at the moment. This attention has followed the release of some pretty stark national NAPLAN data which points to some concerning trends with boys' achievement especially in Year 9. I am pleased that our boys defy this trend completely with 11 of the 12 NAPLAN areas for Years 7 and 9 well above the National, State and SSG (Similar School Group) averages. Because of the school's huge success at reversing the trend in boys' poor achievement, I received a request from the Department's media unit to participate in an interview with Julie Hare the education Editor for the Financial Review. THE EYE: FROM LIGHT COMES SIGHT

Students in Year 12 Biology have been studying disorders of the human body and the technologies used as treatment. In particular, they have learnt about the structure and function of the eye and conducted a dissection of a cow's eye to observe the structures involved in sight first hand. They have conducted practical activities using lenses and ray boxes to explore accommodation, the process by which the lens changes its convexity in response to light arriving from near and distant objects, and to determine which types of spectacle lenses can be used to treat disorders like myopia and hyperopia. In addition, students have investigated laser eye surgery and cataracts.


















BUNDANON VISUAL ARTS CAMP


