CHINESE CLASSES

Year 9 Chinese



Students in Year 9 Chinese class were asked to design a Chinese story book by choosing a Chinese-culture related item as their main character. In the story book, students describe the appearance and hobby of the character; the choice of clothes; the characteristics of the bedroom in terms of size, item, tidiness and set up; and the daily routine of the character in Chinese. Students have been very creative with the design of their storybook, they wrote interesting stories such as "Run, roast Chinese pork!", "Yin and Yang" and "The story of a big fat steamed bun". Students in Year 9 were also able to justify the choice of the character in Chinese, and sequence the daily routine by using Chinese characters! All students were capable in introducing their character in Chinese and read out their fantastic stories confidently in front of the class!

Students in Year 8 Chinese classes were asked to design a menu of a food truck in Chinese. In this task, students are expected to demonstrate their understanding of the Chinese food culture and their knowledge across different types of cuisines. On the menu, Year 8 students wrote down different dishes and drinks they wanted to sell, and include a special lunch deal in Chinese. Students also included pictures of the food that are either hand drawn or selected from the internet.

Students in Year 8 presented their menu creatively in many ways. Some menus are designed for a food truck located in Okinawa, some were even designed for food trucks in Mars! In fact, Fox Sillence from 8D, created an actual food truck along with a menu! Fantastic job!

TRAIN DISRUPTIONS MONDAY 21ST AND FRIDAY 25TH NOVEMBER




