Dear Parents,

We are holding a series of parent teacher interviews for Years 7,8,9 and 10. You will be able to select which night (s) suit you best and book accordingly.

Please do not **DOUBLE or TRIPLE book the same subject,** staff only need to talk to you once about your son and their subject area.

Tuesday 17th May, face to face interviews will be held in the hall for 7,8,9 and 10 Thursday 2nd June, face to face interviews will be held in the hall for 7,8,9 and 10 Thursday 16th June, phone interviews will be held for 7,8,9 and 10

For example, you may wish to book across two of these dates to enable access to all relevant teachers. Or you may only be available on one of the three nights and thus would book accordingly. Please check that you are booking for the correct date.

We ask that interviews are kept to a maximum of 10 minutes (as per booking), to ensure we stay on schedule. We anticipate that the **17**th **May, and 2**nd **June interviews** will be conducted face to face in a COVID safe manner. (Masks are encouraged but not compulsory). If required, we will switch these to phone interviews and contact you accordingly.

On **Thursday 16th June**, most staff will call from a mobile with a No Caller ID, so please ensure that you answer No Caller ID calls around your appointment times.



LEARNING THE TYPES OF BANDAGING


Year 11 PDHPE students have been learning about first aid and management of injuries and medical conditions. Students learn how to apply various types of bandages and slings.

YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH SCREENING

Our school is excited to be participating in a study on youth mental health screening in schools, conducted by Macquarie University in partnership with the NSW Department of Education and Ministry of Health, The Association of Independent Schools of NSW, and Catholic Schools NSW, along with the NSW Mental Health Commission.

Sadly, more than half of Australian young people with mental health disorders do not get treatment. This study aims to transform the management of mental (or emotional) health in young people by identifying youth who are struggling with emotional distress and getting them to appropriate help early.

What are the benefits for my child?

- Access to free emotional health screening for students in Year 7 to Year 11 that will identify students who may be experiencing, or at risk of experiencing, emotional distress (this information will be confidential and known only to the school and parents of identified students)
- Recommendations tailored to your child on local, evidence-based referral services, provided to the school by expert researchers and clinicians
- Increased knowledge for school mental health staff in methods of identifying and supporting students who may need help
