The time has come for us to offer the Award to our Participants for 2022 so I will be doing an online information session for potential new participants and their parents at 5.30pm on Tuesday 31 May. 

PAPER TRUSS BRIDGE DESIGN CHALLENGE

In this activity Year 9 Engineering students design, construct, and test the strength of a paper truss bridge and satisfy certain conditions like span, strength, and cost. Students perform the truss bridge strength estimation using a graphic interface that determine stress-compression on the truss elements using the method of joints. Students work in teams to design and build their own bridge.
