PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

On behalf of the whole staff can I please thank everyone for the large volume of congratulations we have received after I announced that the school had been presented with the 2022 Secretary's Award for school achievement. If you missed the email sent earlier in the week, I accepted this award with Year 12 Prefect Kush Kumar on Tuesday evening at the Sydney Town Hall. The award was presented by Georgina Harrison, Secretary NSW Department of Education and is a significant public recognition of the school's sustained success.

Jane Caro AM, who hosted the event, noted that the Secretary's Achievement award is such a prestigious one because the bar for its presentation is set so high. Schools who receive this award demonstrate high achievement and student improvement which is both measurable and sustained.

The citation for the award from the program follows:

Ashfield Boys achieves significant and measurable gains in student outcomes. These have been driven by evidence-based programs which strategically target areas of student need. A driver has been identifying efficacy as the common factor in promoting success. The power of efficacy has been harnessed through student voice in planning, a P&C which develops the whole community and teacher collective efficacy to drive learning. The success of the school's improvement journey is reflected in performance data including high level HSC results, value-add near the top of NSW, NAPLAN scores above NSW and SSG averages and wellbeing indictors above NSW norms.






GRAPHICS: A UNIVERSAL LANGUAGE

ALLERGEN ADVICE

A concept that we continually stress at our school is that we are a community and in successful communities people all look out for each other.

We reminded the boys in our daily notices this week about being careful of allergens and of the need to think about others. It would be great if parents could reinforce this at home. We ask that the boys do not share food with their friends because they may be totally unaware of the possible allergic or anaphylactic reactions that may result. We also have reminded the boys that we cannot guarantee that the school is allergen free and they need to take particular care if they have a known condition. While we actively discourage having nuts on site it isn't possible to guarantee this. If you could reinforce this in your discussions at home it would help us immensely.
