DEBATING EXCURSION AND TRYOUTS

Attending State Final for the Premiers Debating Challenge Years 9/10

On Monday fifteen students from the Year 7, 8 and 9 debating teams attended the State Final of the Premiers Debating Challenge for Years 9 and 10, between North Sydney Girls High and Lindfield Learning Village at the Theatre Royal in the CBD. This allowed our keenest junior debaters to see the sophistication of argument, the structure and timing, and the expert level persuasive delivery of the speeches, or in debating



terms, their Matter, Method and Manner. Our students were attentive and supportive of both teams and were perfectly behaved as they observed the highest level of the competition.

Attending Regional JSDC Try-Outs

Our Year 9 debaters, Daniel Hunt and Ethan Macatangay attended a day long try-out for the Sydney Region team for the Junior State Debating Championships at Kirrawee High School last Thursday. BRENT SANDERS – CREATING POWER THROUGH KNOWLEDGE

Year 10 students participated in a presentation by Brent Sanders called "Life Choices for Young Men". Life Choices for Young Men is a course designed specifically to address issues confronting young men, (Years 9- 12), in the new millennium.

This is not a self-protection seminar but rather a presentation to address what are relevant issues facing young men in our society.

The main focus behind Life Choices for Young Men is to deliver a frank, open and down-toearth presentation to the boys which examines



critical issues such as peer pressure, decision making, self-discipline, respect, motivation and essential keys required for success.

Three key elements addressed in the presentation are:

- 1. Taking responsibility for yourself and your actions
- 2. Life is all about choice
- 3. The importance of respect and self-discipline

The course also includes an in-depth discussion around sexual assault, indecent assault, consent and respect within relationships.

School Student Travel

Term 4 2023

2024 school travel applications are now open

Students who need a new or replacement School Opal card or travel pass for 2024 can <u>apply</u> now. A new application will need to be submitted if they are applying for the first time, or if they are requesting an additional travel entitlement because of a new shared parental arrangement (e.g. joint custody).

Students who change address, school, campus location, have repeated a year or received an expiry notification for their school travel entitlement should <u>renew or update</u> their details <u>before</u> the end of term 4. This will ensure that schools can endorse applications, and travel passes remain valid for the start of the 2024 school year. School Opal card holders will have the changes applied to their existing card.

If a student's distance eligibility has changed based on their grade (i.e. grade two to grade three), the system will automatically update their entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new eligibility criteria, we will send an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition that is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

Students in the Opal network applying for an Opal card (including a Term Bus Pass) for the first time will receive their Student Opal card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2024.

Students living in rural and regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the start of the new school year from their nominated transport operator. It may come via the school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note**: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

Changes to your bus service provider

Within Greater Sydney, a number of bus service providers have changed their names.

Parents intending to lodge an application for a School Opal card will need to visit <u>transportnsw.info</u> <u>trip planner</u> to obtain the correct bus operator name servicing your area prior to lodging an application.

Travel from Term 12024

We ask that parents plan ahead and make sure their child knows which service/s to use and has a valid ticket to travel; either a School Opal card or Child/Youth Opal card (within Greater Sydney) or a School Travel Pass (outside Greater Sydney), from the start of the school year.

Applications for 2024 School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) travel open at the start of Term 4 2023, so parents/students can <u>apply</u> or <u>update</u> details early and be ready for the start of the new school year.


Most students using the Opal network will not need a new Opal card and can continue travelling on their existing card each year.

The start of the year is a busy period for local transport operators, and students travelling without a valid ticket make service planning and operations difficult.

We recognise that for some families last minute changes to school enrolments mean they may not have a School Opal card or Travel Pass for the start of term. In the Opal network, we strongly encourage these families to have their children travel with a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their <u>local bus operator</u> to discuss their travel needs.

Bus operators are flexible and understanding, particularly at the start of the school year, and will ensure students can travel safely to and from school. But to best support our operators we encourage all students to have a valid ticket, as early as possible, from the start of the school year.

Students using School Opal cards are also reminded that they must tap on and tap off in line with the Student code of conduct and Opal terms of use.

We have been working on ways to keep you informed regarding your son's high school journey. At Ashfield Boys High, we use two web-based software programs to deliver communication to you regarding your sons.

Sentral Parent Portal and App features

Newsfeed and Daily Notices - Receive newsfeed and daily notices about **important events** that relate to your child.

Absence Notifications – You will receive and can send absence notifications to the school guickly and easily from within the app.

Sick bay - SMS sent when student is in sick bay.

Academic Reports – View student reports

School Bytes Portal features

Event Management – Information regarding excursions or variations of routine are available here, including permission notes and excursion payments.

Sport Selection – Twice a year students from years 7 to 10 select sports that they would like to participate in. This is all managed in School Bytes including sport selection, parent permission and payment if applicable.

Finance – View your Statement of Account and make a payment.

We have noticed that a number of parents have not accessed or are not using the parent portals /apps. To keep up to date with school events, please make sure you have access to these, as we will be posting valuable information on them next term.

1. Please keep your contact details with the school current.

If you believe that your contact details need updating, please use the "Change of Address" form on our website to update and return the form to the school via email.

2. Reporting your son's absence from school.

- Sentral Portal Access your account on the Sentral website or app and submit the necessary information under the Absence tab.

By using one of these methods, you will help streamline the attendance process and minimise any potential miscommunication.

- 3. **Extended Leave**: When your son is taking extended leave, please complete the "Leave Application and Leave Certificate" form on our website. *This must be completed and returned together with a flight itinerary for Principal approval prior to departure.*
- **4. Emails:** If you are not receiving emails from the school, please check your SPAM/JUNK mail folder as emails maybe going into this folder.
