PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

2023 HSC Results

Congratulations to the Year 12 class of 2023 who have yet again performed incredibly well in the HSC! Despite some of my concerns this year, this group has performed better than last year's exceptional results. Our 2023 Dux is Louie Comitogianni with an outstanding ATAR of 99.4 placing him in the top 0.5% of the state. Overall, the 103 candidates achieved 14 ATARs over 90 with 7 of these over 95. There were also a large number of young men who achieved ATARs between 88 and 90 meaning that almost 25% of the cohort achieved ATARs above 88. Our percentage of results in the top two bands increased again to 30.6% and 66.35% were in the top 3 performance Bands.

Obviously, I am incredibly proud of these results. I am equally as proud of every young man who achieved the HSC credential, many of whom experienced personal hardship to get there. While the destinations of the boys are as varied as they are themselves, university is the overwhelming pathway of choice. At this stage university offers are still in flux with multiple rounds still to come.

Of course, none of this happens in isolation and the boys are well aware of this. It takes our whole village to make such success happen. Thank you for the overwhelming parent support that we enjoy in our school community. It is very much appreciated by our staff.

The Million Word Man competition

There were 114 Million Word Men this year which is another increase. The ultimate winner was Liam from 8C who racked up an incredible total of over 19 million words! Thanks to our wonderful P&C for their very generous support of the program and for providing the gift cards as prizes. I started distributing the gift cards to the winners yesterday. If your son is due to receive a reward, he can collect this from me when he is next at school.








BUS SERVICE CHANGES FROM SUNDAY 10 DECEMBER

From Sunday 10 December the timetables of some Inner West buses operated by Transit Systems are being adjusted to improve reliability and reflect customer demand.

Changes to route bus timetables

Timetable adjustments will occur on routes **389**, **428**, **431**, **433**, **437**, **438X**, **440**, **441**, **442**, **445**, **461X**, **464**, **466**, **469**, **470**, **502**, **503**, **504** and **504X**.

Changes to school bus timetables

To better match traffic conditions there will be timetable adjustments on some school routes. Note that <u>some services will operate earlier</u> than they currently do, so students are requested to plan their trip before travelling.

In addition to the timetable changes, please note that the following route change will occur:

681s (Fort Street High School to Strathfield via Ashfield Boys High School): this route will
no longer operate. Students can use Route 480 for travel towards Ashfield and
Strathfield.

Trip planning

The best way for students to confirm departure times of buses from their bus stop is by planning ahead on Trip Planner transportnsw.info/trip before travelling or to download the Opal Travel app. To ensure dedicated school services appear as a travel option for students, click 'refine' and select the 'school bus' option.

Sentral Parent Portal and App features

Newsfeed and Daily Notices - Receive newsfeed and daily notices about **important events** that relate to your child.

Absence Notifications – You will receive and can send absence notifications to the school guickly and easily from within the app.

Sick bay - SMS sent when student is in sick bay.

Academic Reports – View student reports

School Bytes Portal features

Event Management – Information regarding excursions or variations of routine are available here, including permission notes and excursion payments.

Sport Selection – Twice a year students from years 7 to 10 select sports that they would like to participate in. This is all managed in School Bytes including sport selection, parent permission and payment if applicable.

Finance – View your Statement of Account and make a payment.

We have noticed that a number of parents have not accessed or are not using the parent portals /apps. To keep up to date with school events, please make sure you have access to these, as we will be posting valuable information on them next term.






Student Payments

1. Please keep your contact details with the school current.
