ABHS 2023 CHESS TOURNAMENT



This year 22 players registered to battle for the ABHS Chess Champion title.

The favourite to win was Ben Harding, who has excelled on Board 1 in the interschool competition, at online chess and in Over-The-Board weekend tournaments. Last years' champion Daniel Hunt would be one of Ben's main challengers along with a cohort of surprise improvers.

What eventuated was a run away victory by Ben (8 wins from 8 games) and an extremely competitive 'secondary tournament' for the minor placings.

In a Swiss chess tournament no-one is eliminated. Instead pairings for each round are based on current tournament score (which accumulates as 1 point for each win, ½ for a draw, 0 for a loss). Gradually over 8 rounds (in this instance) a player will gravitate toward their performance level in the tournament. Every player gets to play 8 competitive games over the day.

After three rounds the undefeated players were Ben, Victor Moe and Rayhaan Mohammed. Daniel had already conceded a draw. Ben defeated each of these challengers in succession to essentially end competition for the title. Rayhaan proved to be the most improved player of the year and his game against Ben extended into an endgame (Rook + 3 Pawns vs Bishop + Pawn) which required Ben to play precisely to win.

Victor was another surprise 'find' never having attended chess club but accounting for many good wins in his tournament. With a strong start he ended up playing against the best opposition and he earned a lot of respect for his game. Two other high finishing players worthy of note are Josh Jiju with very consistent play and Armando Pagano who combines great attacking flair with a wonderful positive attitude and humour.

More than half the tournament players were from Year 7 & 8 and a number of them have the potential to challenge for the title in years to come. Jason Feng, Roger Xue, Sean Rong, Divyam Vaghela and Taro Gosling all won prizes.





It was also great to see three Year 11/12 players participate in their last school championship. Best wishes to Rayhaan, Mohammed Haseeb and Aiden Maloney for their HSC studies. Their

chess abilities surely give a boost to their academic efforts. A small mention also to Louie Commitogiani who successfully completed his HSC this year and was a dedicated chess club member and past school champion.

Looking ahead into 2024, it's exciting to see that Ashfield Boys has strong players available for Junior and Intermediate teams in the interschool competition. We may even be able to field two Intermediate teams (Years 9-10). Play lots of chess over the coming Christmas Holidays!

All players deserve commendation for their sportsmanship and effort even if occasionally blundering a queen or suddenly finding their King check mated. It happens to the best.

BUS SERVICE CHANGES FROM SUNDAY 10 DECEMBER

From Sunday 10 December the timetables of some Inner West buses operated by Transit Systems are being adjusted to improve reliability and reflect customer demand.

Changes to route bus timetables

Timetable adjustments will occur on routes **389**, **428**, **431**, **433**, **437**, **438X**, **440**, **441**, **442**, **445**, **461X**, **464**, **466**, **469**, **470**, **502**, **503**, **504** and **504X**.

Changes to school bus timetables

To better match traffic conditions there will be timetable adjustments on some school routes. Note that <u>some services will operate earlier</u> than they currently do, so students are requested to plan their trip before travelling.

In addition to the timetable changes, please note that the following route change will occur:

681s (Fort Street High School to Strathfield via Ashfield Boys High School): this route will
no longer operate. Students can use Route 480 for travel towards Ashfield and
Strathfield.

Trip planning

The best way for students to confirm departure times of buses from their bus stop is by planning ahead on Trip Planner transportnsw.info/trip before travelling or to download the Opal Travel app. To ensure dedicated school services appear as a travel option for students, click 'refine' and select the 'school bus' option.

Dear Parents

We have been working on ways to keep you informed regarding your son's high school journey. At Ashfield Boys High, we use two web-based software programs to deliver communication to you regarding your sons.

Sentral Parent Portal and App features

Newsfeed and Daily Notices - Receive newsfeed and daily notices about **important events** that relate to your child.

Absence Notifications – You will receive and can send absence notifications to the school guickly and easily from within the app.

Sick bay - SMS sent when student is in sick bay.

Academic Reports – View student reports

School Bytes Portal features

Event Management – Information regarding excursions or variations of routine are available here, including permission notes and excursion payments.

Sport Selection – Twice a year students from years 7 to 10 select sports that they would like to participate in. This is all managed in School Bytes including sport selection, parent permission and payment if applicable.

Finance – View your Statement of Account and make a payment.

We have noticed that a number of parents have not accessed or are not using the parent portals /apps. To keep up to date with school events, please make sure you have access to these, as we will be posting valuable information on them next term.






Student Payments

Student Administration Updates

1. Please keep your contact details with the school current.

If you believe that your contact details need updating, please use the "Change of Address" form on our website to update and return the form to the school via email.

2. Reporting your son's absence from school.

To ensure your son's absence from school is as smooth and efficient as possible we kindly request that you use one of the following methods:

- Sentral Portal Access your account on the Sentral website or app and submit the necessary information under the Absence tab.
- Via email: <u>ashfieldbo-h.school@det.nsw.edu.au</u>). In the email, include your son's name, grade, date of absence and a brief reason for the absence.

By using one of these methods, you will help streamline the attendance process and minimise any potential miscommunication.

- 3. **Extended Leave**: When your son is taking extended leave, please complete the "Leave Application and Leave Certificate" form on our website. *This must be completed and returned together with a flight itinerary for Principal approval prior to departure.*
- **4. Emails:** If you are not receiving emails from the school, please check your SPAM/JUNK mail folder as emails maybe going into this folder.
