ask questions in a safe and supportive environment. The boys enjoyed the activities and hopefully left the day better informed and more prepared for the future.







#### **HEALTH AND MOVEMENT SCIENCE**

Students in Year 11 HMS have been participating in a unit titled, The Body and Mind in Motion. As a part of the unit students learn about first aid and emergency care practices and procedures. Students learn in a practical and theoretical sense how to deal with various scenarios and apply CPR with appropriate ratios in addition to perfecting how to perform recovery positions and the stages of DRSABCD.





Danger: check the environment for dangers to yourself and those involved.

Response: check for a response; ask for questions, squeeze palms.

Send: Call 000 and seek additional support.

Airways: Clear airways by removing anything obstructing breathing.

Breathing: Look, listen and feel for signs of breathing. CPR: Chest compressions and rescue breaths 30:2 ratio. Defibrillator: If accessible apply defib and follow instructions.








# BALSA BRIDGE TESTING TIME ENGINEERING CHALLENGE

#### **NSW SCHOOL VACCINATION PROGRAM**

In 2025 the following vaccines will be offered:

In Year 7, students are offered free vaccines for diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis (whooping cough), (dTpa) a human papillomavirus (HPV). In Year 10, students are offered the meningococcal ACWY vaccine.

Vaccination will only be provided at school if consent has been received.

If your child is in Year 7 or Year 10, you can give consent online for their routine school vaccinations.

#### **How to Provide Consent:**

- 1. To complete online consent for your child's school vaccinations, visit the <u>School Vaccination</u>

  <u>Program online consent portal (https://engage.health.nsw.gov.au/engage)</u>
- 2. For detailed steps on how to provide consent, please refer to the NSW Health webpage <a href="How to Provide Consent">How to Provide Consent</a> (https://www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation/Pages/online-consent-school-vaccination.aspx).
- 3. Follow the steps to log in to your existing ServiceNSW account. This is the same account you may already use to renew your driver's licence. If you don't have a ServiceNSW account, refer to <a href="https://www.service.nsw.gov.au/services/myservicensw-account/how-to-create-an-account">https://www.service.nsw.gov.au/services/myservicensw-account/how-to-create-an-account</a> to create an account.
- 4. Update or confirm your personal details in ServiceNSW as required.
- 5. Complete the School Vaccination Consent Form for your child/ren. You will need to:
  - a. Enter your child's personal details
  - b. Provide the Medicare card details for you and your child
  - Read the linked Parent Information Sheet and privacy statement. Translations are available in 28 languages please refer to the NSW Health webpage https://www.health.nsw.gov.au immunisation/Pages/school\_vaccination\_language.as px
  - d. Provide consent.

If you or your child do not have a Medicare card, internet access or you are unable to complete the online consent, ask your child's school for a paper consent form.

#### The benefits of providing consent online:

- SMS notification three days before the clinic to remind you of the vaccination day
- easily update your child's details
- receive SMS and/or email notifications when vaccinations are given
- faster upload of vaccination records to the Australian Immunisation Register (AIR).




